



# A Fundraiser Coffee for the Maasailand Health Project

The **Maasailand Health Project** (MLHP) was founded in November 2009 by Port Angeles residents Tom & Rhonda Curry after a visit to the Maasai village of Oldupai Boma in Tanzania. They learned that malaria poses a major threat in Tanzania, especially to the underserved villages of the nomadic Maasai people who have little or no access to medical services. The goal of the **Maasailand Health Project** is to facilitate prevention and treatment of malaria and establish programs to train local Maasai villagers to provide medical assessment and treatment. Through the generosity of MLHP's first donors, in just over a month after launching the organization Tom Curry had 100 medicated malaria nets and medications on the ground in Oldupai Boma.

Denise Brennan, owner of Princess Valiant Coffee joined the MLHP board in January 2010 and suggested a coffee fundraiser for additional malaria supplies for the Maasai. **Tanzania Kahowa Peaberry** is now available at \$12 per pound, and the entire \$12 is donated to the **Maasailand Health Project**. Fresh-roasted, whole bean or ground, this is a fragrant, mellow, low-acid Arabica coffee grown in the volcanic soil of Tanzania.
